Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">Number Facts - You are a very special person! How many number facts can you write about yourself? e.g. I am 6 years old. I have 2 pet cats and 3 pet fish. I have 1 sister. I live at 97 Rose Hill. I was born in 2014.Number Facts - Choose a special person in your life. It could be someone you know or your favourite famous person who is special to you. Find out how old they are. How many number facts can you create for their age? e.g. My special person is my big sister Emily and she is 10 years old. $5 + 5 = 10$ $12 - 2 = 10$ $2 \times 5 = 10$ $20 \div 2 = 10$Money – See <u>Sweet Shop Sheet</u> uploaded to class page. You are going to buy some treats for your special person. How much do your treats cost? Year 1 – What coins can you recognise? Can you find the correct money to buy your treats? Year 2 – Choose more than one treat to buy. What coins will you need? How much do your items cost altogether? Challenge: List all of the treats you could buy with 70p.Money – Visit this <u>interactive toy shop</u> and choose the correct coins to buy your special person some treat!Counting - Special people who help us. Play the 'I spy' game to spot how many special people can help us. When you have completed your search, use a blank piece of paper to create your own version for a family member! (I spy game template uploaded on class page).Measuring – Use measuring jugs, cups and spoons to create a special potion for a special person. As it is almost Father's Day you may like to choose what makes a special Dad. e.g.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Read: What Makes me a ME? (PPT on class page) Discuss the different comparisons the little boy thinks of. How many do you recall? What does he mean? e.g. 'Perhaps I'm like a puppy dog. We're always FULL of beans.'Identify words written in capital letters and italics. Why might this be? How do you read these words?Punctuation search! How many different types of punctuation can you spot in the story? Discuss what they are used for.What books can you find at home about special people/relationships and friendships? Read them with a family member.Read the Year 1 / Year 2 common exception words and time how long it takes for you to read them all. Can you beat your score by the end of the week?

(PPT on class page) Discuss: What makes you a YOU? Discuss your special skills and qualities. Make a list together. Then choose your favourite to write about and illustrate. Why are your friends and family special? Draw a picture of your friends and family and write at least three things that make them special! Act out all of the different characteristics the boy talks about e.g. 'As slow as a snail'. Then create a text map of key parts. Can you retell to a family member? Listen to 'People who help us – Stories for kids'. Discuss how many people help us and how many of these people have become even more appreciated in most recent times. Choose somebody to write a thank you letter to, for helping us and keeping us safe. Listen to A Perfect Father's Day. What makes your dad special? Write an acrostic poem using the word Father/ Dad or for someone else special to you! e.g. Funny and tells great jokes Amazing at building dens Takes time to do my homework with me Helps me tie my shoes Eats sweets with me Reads me stories
<p>Learning Project - to be done throughout the week:</p>	
<p>The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to think about special people in their lives and express their thoughts and feelings. They can think about the qualities that make themselves special and unique, while also thinking about how we can all help each other.</p>	
<p><u>Self - portrait</u> – Create a self-portrait using mirrors for accuracy. When you are finished, write one thing that is special about you / you are proud of.</p>	
<p><u>Singing</u> – Listen to this song about being unique. Can you join in and create a dance?</p>
