Maths Tasks

This week, you are going to use your maths skills to plan your own end-of-year party!

Activity 1-Design a survey to find out people's favourite party food or drink. Ask people-your family, or your bubble- your questions, then present your findings in a table and graph.

Activity 2-Create your shopping list, and find out how much it will cost-remember to work out the price for your whole family, your bubble or even your whole class.

Activity 3-Can you use the nets of 3D shapes and some string to make some bunting to decorate your party? Talk about the properties of the shapes as you make them. You can even decorate them with symmetrical patterns.



Activity 4-Design a 100 square table-cloth for your party-can you create 100 colours? Find out how here-


Remember to have the party at the end of the week to celebrate your hard work, and share some pictures with us on Seesaw or Twitter!
