We must still keep each other safe so you must stay at least two metres away from everyone. We have to look after each other to stay safe and well. We will be promoting social distancing.




We will be asking you to wash your hands more often to stop you and others getting sick.



When you arrive at school you will be greeted by a member of staff who will welcome you in with a smile.

We will ask you to come in one at a time.

We will then take your temperature using a thermometer.



Hand-washing technique with soap and water



1 Wet hands with water



2 Apply enough soap to cover all hand surfaces




3 Rub hands palm to palm



4 Rub back of each hand with palm of other hand with fingers interlaced



5 Rub palm to palm with fingers interlaced



6 Rub with back of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked



7 Rub each thumb clasped in opposite hand using a rotational movement




8 Rub tips of fingers in opposite palm in a circular motion



9 Rub each wrist with opposite hand




10 Rinse hands with water



11 Use elbow to turn off tap



12 Dry thoroughly with a single-use towel




13 Hand washing should take 15-30 seconds

Hand washing will become part of our daily routine.


We will wash our hands before snack, before and after playtime and before and after lunch time.

We will wash our hands when we arrive at school and before we go home.

There is a maximum capacity of people allowed in each room which means your children will be placed in smaller groups. In most classrooms there will be a maximum of 8 people. For the time being these are being referred to as a 'Bubble'. School staff will be in each 'Bubble' to lead activities and support the children throughout the day. Children will not necessarily be with their own teacher or in their own classroom, but children will be grouped broadly based on age.



You will have your own bag containing pens and pencils. These are only for you. You must not swap or let anyone else use things from your bag. If you need anything, please just ask the member of staff in the room.
