




Suggestions for improvements	
You said	Response from school
Time to meet with teachers/ SENDCO outside of parents' evenings	This term, we introduced termly SEND parent events that will happen at the beginning of each term. Additionally, we will be introducing a drop in session to meet with the SENDCo on the same evening as Parents' Evening. If you are concerned or have any questions, we will always make ourselves available to meet with you as soon as possible.
More staff in classes to allow for more support	We would love to be able to facilitate this, but we are bound by budgets. We do regularly review our systems and procedures to make sure that our children get the best offer possible.
Continue to develop methods to allow for clearer communication between home and school	The SENDCo's email is on the school website and can be contacted directly or via the school office. We have changed our method of communication for Learning Plans and whilst this is new, we are hopeful that parents will find Learning Plans easier to navigate. If you do have any questions about your child's progress or provision, then please get in touch with your child's class teacher in the first instance.
Better transition between Year 2 and Year 3	This is something that we are looking at enhancing and we'll hopefully have some news about this in the summer term.
Help us to better understand the provisions available in school	We do have various levels of provision within school which are in line with our graduated approach. Our SEN Report details provision that is available in school. This is available on the school website.
Share patterns of behaviour	In line with our behaviour policy, you will be notified of all stage 3 behaviours as soon as possible. If we notice a pattern of behaviour, we will always notify you asap. If behaviours don't improve then we will seek to implement a behaviour chart and may consider getting support from the Behaviour Intervention Team.


